Tumi's power kit includes an electric adaptor with four different international plugs that work in 150 countries. It also converts to a USB power charger for small devices. The kit includes a retractable USB cable, a phone power tips set and car adapter, all in a case.

of gloves — what's not to love? The iconic Burberry plaid gets a funky update with a squiggly check. In a merino wool/cashmere blend.

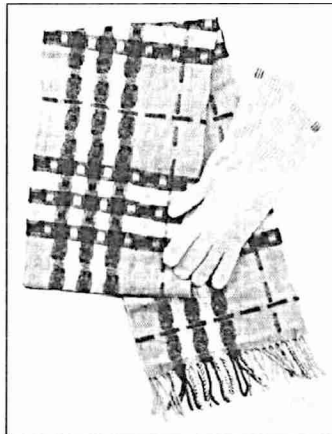
For the jet-setter (him): JBL

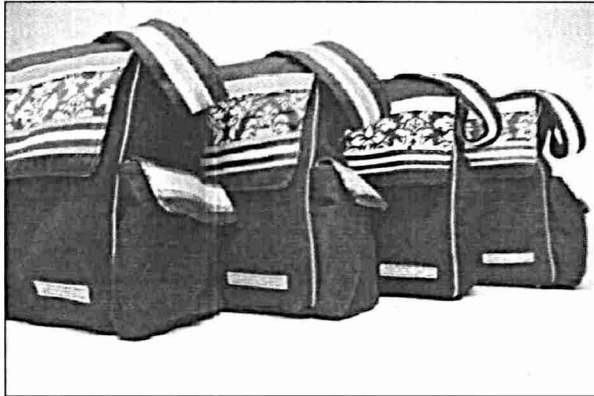
